COMMISSIONERS REPORT FOR 2022 Annual Meeting May 2, 2023

OPERATIONS:

During the year 2022, the district had a total of one thousand three hundred ninety-four customers as of December 31, 2022.

A total of 198,227,000 gallons were pumped into the system, as recorded at the pumping station located on Main Street and Scar Hill Road.

A total of 173,653,000 gallons were recorded through customer meters. Some of the water losses are accounted for as follows:

- A. Main and Service Leaks: 4.0 million gallons
- B. Hydrant Flushing: 2,500,000 gallons and new main construction
- C. Fire Department use: 500,000 gallons
- D. Bleeders/ Blow Offs: 530,000 gallons
- E. Unaccounted water: 16,200,000 (8.2%)
- F. Street Cleaning:100,000
- G. Flow Testing: 200,000

The repairs to the system were as follows:

1200' 8" Ductile Iron Installed at Barnard Hill Road

- 2500' 6" Ductile Iron replaced at FED EX on Pine Hill Drive

The pumping facilities are inspected daily, and the meter readings are recorded. The storage tanks are inspected monthly per order of the DEP.

The Massachusetts DEP is sent the results of water samples tested at the RI Analytical Inc. in Hudson, MA on a monthly schedule. We can report that our water supply is in good condition.
